

## SOMETIMES **SILENCE** SAYS IT ALL...

During the Memphis, TN Sanitation Strike of 1968 to demand collective bargaining, the workers carried signs which read, "I <u>AM</u> A MAN". This powerful yet simple message said it all—*we are not less than you. Like you, we have rights.* 

**Collective bargaining** is the demand of all people—black, white, Latino and Asian American—who would not be pawns of corporate executives and right-wing politicians: The right to join together for our common dreams, a right denied to many in North Carolina since 1959.

**On April 4, 2011 at 12 Noon and for 15 minutes,** we will commemorate the assassination in Memphis of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. by standing in **total silence** across from the state legislative building while holding similar signs to remind the lawmakers inside that:
