# **2016 HIGHLIGHTS**

In addition to our normal work supporting union organizing and mobilizing around legislative issues and labor-endorsed candidates, we accomplished the following:

#### **ELECTIONS**

★ Designated a Tier 1 'Battleground State' by the national AFL-CIO for the first time in our state federation's history, bringing historic levels of investment and breaking several records in terms of electoral efforts

- ★ Elected Roy Cooper Governor by over 10,000 votes
- ★ Elected Mike Morgan to the NC Supreme Court by nearly 350,000 votes
- ★ Elected Josh Stein as Attorney General and re-elected Beth Wood as State Auditor

- ★ Won four of nine targeted state legislative races
- ★ Knocked 65,000 doors across the state during our first-ever major canvass program
- ★ Held over 20,000 face-to-face conversations
- ★ Held over 5,000 phone conversations with union households
- ★ Filled over 4,500 voter contact shifts
- ★ Engaged over 750 volunteers and 130 release staff
- ★ Exceeded fundraising goals for our Victory Fund

★ Rebated over \$62,000 in per capita dues to Central Labor Councils through our unified per capita program

March on Reynolds

- ★ Helped to raise over \$6,000 to escalate the Farm Labor Organizing Committee's Reynolds American campaign, now in its 8th year
- ★ Raised thousands of dollars in funding for AFL-CIO constituency groups, including \$5,100 for the North Carolina Alliance for Retired Americans Education Fund and \$15,000 for the North Carolina A. Philip Randolph Institute
- ★ Raised \$10,000 for AFL-CIO community affiliate, Working America
- ★ Held our first Advanced Carolina Labor School in over 20 years
- ★ Continued to build our Young Workers Initiative with groups in Charlotte and Fayetteville
- ★ Expanded our support for organizing by hosting an Organizing Institute in Charlotte, convening the Organizing Roundtable, and supporting affiliate campaigns

#### **RAISING THE BAR**

★ Supported campaigns that won living wages and paid leave for city and county workers in Greensboro, Durham, and Wake County

- ★ Celebrated State Federation President James Andrews being named a "Champion of Justice" by the North Carolina Justice Center
- ★ Extended our social media outreach
  - » on Twitter, where activists, journalists, and other influencers received our messages over 900,000 times
  - » on Facebook, where we have grown our following by over 1000 people since this time last year and where the combined reach of our posts surpassed 2.2 million views
- ★ Gained more traction for our #OrganizeTheSouth message through expanded use of the hashtag on Twitter and with presentations for national and regional labor organizations
