2021 HIGHLIGHTS

ANNUAL CONVENTION

★ Organized a safe and successful in-person 64th Annual Convention in Wilmington with over 300 attendees and speakers including Gov. Cooper and national union leaders.

- ★ Re-elected MaryBe McMillan to a second term as state labor federation President and elected a new Executive Board including 10 new Vice Presidents.
- ★ Honored retired state fed attorney Mike Okun with the title of General Counsel Emeritus and the inaugural James Andrews Lifetime Service Award.
- ★ Honored North Carolina I.A.T.S.E. Locals with the 2021 P.R. Latta Rank-and-File Award for maintaining solidarity throughout the pandemic.

POLICY PROGRESS

- ★ Defeated an attempt to cripple North Carolina's Retaliation Employment Discrimination Act.
- ★ Helped secure passage of the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, which will provide over \$8.7 billion to improve transportation and broadband access and create good union jobs in North Carolina.

AFFILIATE SUPPORT

- ★ Supported National Nurses United in securing a first contract for 1,800 nurses at Mission Health in Asheville.
- ★ Provided flood disaster relief to members of USW 507.
- ★ Laid the groundwork for a campaign to restore the freedom of state and local government workers to have union contracts.
- Worked with Building Trades unions and elected officials to promote offshore wind production and the creation of good, union jobs in the clean energy sector.



BUILDING POWER

- ★ Held a town hall with newly elected members of Congress and workers safety town hall with new N.C. Labor Commissioner Josh Dobson.
- ★ Conducted a free 7-month online training series for N.C. labor leaders and activists on topics including lobbying, public speaking, labor law, and social media.
- ★ Developed a racial justice training curriculum and organized trainings in Greensboro, Charlotte, and at the Annual Convention.
- ★ Secured appointments of union members to state boards and commissions.
- ★ Convened a meeting of the AFL-CIO South Central Council in Charlotte to strengthen cooperation between state and local labor bodies across the South.
- ★ Deepened our engagement with organizations allied in the fight for paid leave, living wages, and the creation of good-paying union jobs.
- ★ Hired a WILL Empower apprentice and expanded our paid internship program.
- ★ Welcomed new affiliations by the Musicians and by Building & Construction Trades unions including the Carpenters, Millwrights, and Elevator Constructors.
